COLUMBIA COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS BOARD MEETING

MINUTES September 15, 2004

The Columbia County Board of Commissioners met in scheduled session with Commissioner Rita Bernhard and Commissioner Anthony Hyde, together with Sarah Tyson, Assistant County Counsel and Jan Greenhalgh, Board Secretary. Commissioner Corsiglia was not present.

Commissioner Bernhard called the meeting to order and led the flag salute.

MINUTES:

Commissioner Hyde moved and Commissioner Bernhard seconded to approve the minutes of the September 8, 2004 Board meeting and September 8, 2004 Staff meeting. The motion carried unanimously.

VISITOR COMMENTS:

None.

HEARING: ADOPTING ELECTRICAL INSPECTION ORDINANCE #2004-5:

As scheduled, the public hearing, "In the Matter of Adopting the Columbia County Electrical Inspection Ordinance and Repealing Ordinance No. 95-04", was held.

Sarah Tyson stated that the Board recently adopted changes to the electrical permit fee schedule. When drafting that order, she reviewed the existing ordinance and found that it was outdated in many areas and needed updating. Therefore, she drafted a new ordinance which will repeal the existing ordinance and adopt all the new updates. A hearing needs to be held to adopt this ordinance. Sarah included an emergency clause to allow for the new fee schedule to be in place immediately.

Todd Dugdale, LDS Director, wanted to thank Sarah for bringing this ordinance up to date. The new fee schedule should be adequate to support the program. There has been a lot of public involvement in the new fee structure and it was supported by the building industry.

The hearing was opened for public testimony.

With no public testimony coming before the Board, the hearing was closed for deliberation. After little discussion by the Board, Sarah read Ordinance No. 2004-5 twice by title only and noted that it does include an emergency clause. With that, Commissioner Hyde moved and Commissioner Bernhard seconded to approve Ordinance No. 2004-5, "In the Matter of Adopting the Columbia County Electrical Inspection Ordinance and Repealing Ordinance No. 95-04, to become effective immediately". The motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Bernhard read the consent agenda in full. With that, Commissioner Hyde moved and Commissioner Bernhard seconded to approve the consent agenda as follows:

- (I) Amendment #27 to the 2003-2005 County Financial Assistance Contract #05-001 with State Mental Health.
- (J) Grant Agreement #21908 with ODOT Public Transit Division for operating funds for public transit service.
- (K) Amendment #3 to the Personal Services Contract with URS Corporation.

The motion carried unanimously.

COMMISSIONER BERNHARD COMMENTS:

Commissioner Bernhard missed the county picnic and other activities last weekend because she was attending her husbands class reunion out of town.

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She attended the CCMH ground breaking and everyone seems to be very excited about the new facility.

She also attended the Chamber open house which was very successful.

She gave a presentation about non-profits at Concordia College this week. Rocky Johnson, CAT, teaches the class. There were about 30 students in attendance.

She attended a Workforce Investment meeting. Tillamook is now part of our district. They spent some time looking at the by-laws.

COMMISSIONER HYDE COMMENTS:

Commissioner Hyde reported on the state RC&D meeting he attended in Eugene last week.

He also attended the CCMH groundbreaking. He commented on the CCMH program and the partnership between the county and CCMH in the development of the new facility. He noted that the developer is the same company that is doing the new Transfer Station and we should end up with some cost savings because of that.

He attended the county picnic on Saturday, but was late due to the golf tournament taking so long. He noted that his team came in first place.
