# **COMMISSIONER HYDE COMMENTS:**

On Monday, Commissioner Hyde was invited to speak out at Sauvie Island for the dedication of the \$25 million for the new bridge. This is a good example of how government works. Just two years ago, that bridge was going to be shut down. Part of Sauvie Island is in Columbia County and many county residents work on the island. The bridge should be complete by 2007-2008.

On Friday, the Board was at the Wauna Mill to see the new paper machine. This was a \$200 million construction project. He was interviewed by a paper in Astoria and asked what he thought about all the steel, cement and glass. He responded that he didn't see that, what he saw was people working. This created 110 new jobs and that's why they work on these projects.

## COMMISSIONER CORSIGLIA COMMENTS:

Commissioner Corsiglia was also at the Wauna Mill and feels this will help north county with employment. It is extremely important to have help throughout all the cities in the county for employment. When you have that much investment in a plant, it's a sure sign that it's update and won't be closed down anytime soon.

With nothing further coming before the Board, the meeting was adjourned.
