WHEREAS, pursuant to ORS 368.341(1)(b) the Board of County Commissioners for Columbia County, Oregon adopted Resolution No. 20 - 2004 initiating proceedings to vacate a portion of Bert Bishop Road [aka Bishop Creek Road], a public right-of-way located in Section 32, Township 6 North, Range 2 West, Columbia County, Oregon, pursuant to a petition filed with the Board by John Petersen and Agnes Petersen; and

WHEREAS, that portion of the public right-of-way proposed to be vacated is legally described as follows:

A tract of land in Section 32, Township 6 North, Range 2 West, Willamette Meridian, Columbia County, Oregon, more particularly described as follows:

All that portion of Bert Bishop Road from its intersection with vacated A.A. Smith Road to approximately 20 feet west of the western right-of-way line of County Road No. 41, also known as McDermott Road, Columbia County, Oregon;

and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to ORS 368.351, the Board may make its determination about the vacation of property without holding a hearing if: (1) the County Roadmaster files with the Board a written report that contains his assessment that the vacation would be in the public interest; and (2) the vacation proceedings were initiated by a petition under ORS 368.341 that contains:

"the acknowledged signatures of owners of 100 percent of any private property proposed to be vacated and acknowledged signatures of owners of 100 percent of property abutting any public property proposed to be vacated. The petition must indicate the owners' approval of the proposed vacation";

and

WHEREAS, the Petition meets the signature requirements of ORS 368.351, and County Roadmaster, Dave Hill, filed a report with the Board stating his assessment that the vacation would be in the public interest; a copy of the Roadmaster's report being attached hereto, labeled Attachment "1" and incorporated herein by this reference; and

WHEREAS, despite the fact that, pursuant to ORS 368.351, the Board was authorized to make its determination without holding a hearing, the Board decided to hold a hearing to allow the Petitioners an opportunity to respond to objections raised by neighboring property owners; and

WHEREAS, a map of the area proposed to be vacated is attached hereto, labeled Attachment "2" and incorporated herein by this reference; and

WHEREAS, the Board held a hearing on May 19, 2004, and after hearing from staff and taking public testimony, voted unanimously to grant the Petition because the vacation is in the public interest.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED as follows:

- 1) The property as described herein and as depicted in Attachment "2", is hereby vacated and shall vest in the abutting property owners as provided in ORS 368.366(1)(d) by extension of said owners' abutting property boundaries to the centerline of the vacated public right-of-way.
- 2) This vacation is being made with a specific reservation of any existing right-of-way for utility easements.
- 3) Pursuant to Order No. 55-2001 and the decision of the Board of County Commissioners, the required fee of \$1,000 was paid by the petitioners, \$500 deposited directly into the County Road Fund and \$500 into the General Fund, Fees for Services, Road Vacations, Line Item No. 100-00-3255, out of which the costs shall be paid.
- 4) The \$28.50 filing fee has already been paid to the County Clerk. The Treasurer is hereby authorized to disburse the following amounts from the General Fund, Fees for Services, Road Vacations account as follows:

5) This order shall be recorded with the County Clerk, a copy inserted in the appropriate road jacket, and certified copies shall be filed with the County Surveyor and the County Assessor.

Petition for Vacation of Bishop Creek County Road

John and Agnes Petersen have petitioned the Board of County Commissioners to vacate that portion of Bert Bishop Road from its intersection with vacated A.A. Smith Road to approximately 20 feet west of the western right-of-way line of County Road #41 (Michael McDermott Road), commonly known as Bishop Creek Road.

I have attached a vicinity map, photographs of the roadway, Assessor's map, aerial photograph, and inventory information of official County Road records in the area.

The subject roadway is being used primarily as access to the abutting properties in the area, and occasional use by other citizens. The Road Department has performed very little maintenance on the roadway in the past 10 years. The roadway does not directly access Longview Fibre timberland or other property where hunting or recreational use is allowed.


The Petersen's own three parcels of land abutting the subject roadway, and are the only abutting owner. The size of their parcels are about 70 acres, 63 acres, and 38 acres. I believe there are two homes on these three parcels, but in speaking with Glen Higgins it is unlikely that a third residence would be allowed to be constructed in the near future. It is possible, however, that the third parcel could be sold separately and if the road was vacated that an easement would then need to be granted to the parcel for access. I do not believe that the Petersen's have any intent at this time to sell any of the parcels. ORS 368.331 prohibits the vacation of public lands if the vacation would deprive an owner of a recorded property right of access necessary for the exercise of that property right unless the county governing body has the consent of the owner. In this case, the Petersen's have consented (petitioned) for the road vacation.

Tammy Maygra has let it be known that she and her family object to the vacation of this roadway for reasons as she has explained, as her family has also owned property in this area for a long time.

Other than for access to the property currently owned by the Petersen's, I cannot see any other reason for the public to use this roadway. The road is narrow, not well maintained, and there is not an adequate turn-around at the end for public travel. The Petersen's desire the road vacation to prevent trespass, vandalism and harassment. Vacation of the roadway would allow for greater security of the area, and eliminate the potential for future road maintenance by the County.


Therefore, in the interest of the public, I believe that this roadway should be vacated as proposed.




