ORDER NO. 14 - 2011

WHEREAS, the Columbia County Forest, Parks and Recreation Rules and Regulations prohibit the possession of any loaded firearm or discharge of any firearm, pellet gun, bow and arrow, slingshot or other weapon capable of injuring any person or wildlife in any County Park, including Camp Wilkerson, without the express permission of the Board of County Commissioners; and

WHEREAS, the Army ROTC of the University of Portland (hereinafter the "ROTC") has applied for a permit to hold training exercises at Camp Wilkerson, a County park, from April 1, 2011, to April 3, 2011; and

WHEREAS, the ROTC has requested permission to conduct training using inert, rubberized, M16A2 rifles in accordance with pre-commissioning requirements of Cadet Command Regulation 145-3, Reserve Officers Training Corps Precommissioning Training and Leadership Development, and to have a paintball lane in a restricted portion of the park; and

WHEREAS, a copy of said written request and explanation of how the training shall be conducted is attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by this reference; and

WHEREAS, the ROTC has given assurances that the use of M16A2 and paintball rifles will be well supervised and done safely, and have further agreed to abide by any conditions placed upon the ROTC in connection with these activities; and

WHEREAS, the ROTC has signed a Hold Harmless Agreement indemnifying the County for any injury to person or property arising from its activities during its stay at Camp Wilkerson, and has provided a declaration of self-insured status.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED as follows:

1. The ROTC is granted permission to conduct training using inert, rubberized, M16A2 rifles in accordance with pre-commissioning requirements of CC REG 145-3 and paintball rifles in a restricted area from April 1, 2011, and April 3, 2011, all such activities to be in compliance with the policies, procedures and rules as outlined in the attached Exhibit A.

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2. The ROTC shall comply with all park rules and regulations during its use of the park, except as specifically exempted by this Order.

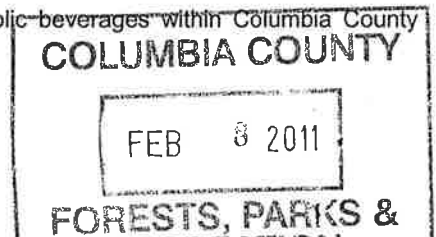
RENTAL CONDITIONS AGREEMENT

COLUMBIA COUNTY

In consideration of permission to use the park facility, the applicant agrees to the following terms and conditions:

FEB 25 2010

1. General
 - a) Reservations will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis.
 - b) A reservation request will not be accepted and processed without a thoroughly completed application.
 - c) Reservations will be confirmed only after County staff have approved the application.
2. Rental Fee
 - a) Refer to "Facility Reservation Rates" sheet for fees or contact Columbia County Parks for fee information.
 - b) Rental fee is due at the time of reservation.
 - c) Cancellation Terms: The Applicant must notify Columbia County Parks of any reservation cancellation no later than 30 days prior to the rental date in order to be refunded the full rental fee (NOTE: a \$10.00 cancellation fee will be deducted from all refunds.) For cancellation notices that are less than 30 days' prior to the rental date, the rental fee for the first day will not be refunded.
3. Insurance Requirement – The Applicant must have liability insurance for the entire event and must provide proof of insurance satisfactory to the County as described in the attached "Insurance Requirements - Frequently Asked Questions."
4. Activities Requiring Board of Commission Approval
 - a) Columbia County park rules prohibit the possession and consumption of alcoholic beverages within Columbia County



parks; however, the Applicant may apply to the County Board of Commissioners for a waiver from the no-alcohol park rule or other park rules.

b) Proposed activities deemed hazardous by Columbia County park staff will require the approval of the Columbia County Board of Commissioners before being allowed in the requested park site.

5. Compliance With Columbia County Park Rules

a) Columbia County reserves the right to establish rules for the use and occupancy of park sites and facilities covered by this application.

b) The Applicant agrees to comply with the established park rules and insure that guests/invitees are made aware of and also comply with the park rules.

6. Hold Harmless Agreement

"I, the undersigned applicant, agree to release, defend, indemnify and hold harmless Columbia County, its officers, agents, and employees, successors and assigns from all claims, suits, actions, liability, damage, loss, cost or expense, including but not limited to attorney fees, that Columbia County, its officers, agents, and employees, successors and assigns may sustain or incur on account of: 1) any damage to or destruction of any property that Columbia County may own or in which it may have an interest; 2) any damage to or destruction of any property belonging to any other person, firm or corporation; and 3) injury to or death of any person or persons as a result of any errors or omissions or other negligent, reckless or intentionally wrongful acts of Applicant, its officers, agents, and employees, members and/or invited guests arising in any manner out of Applicant's use of such facilities."

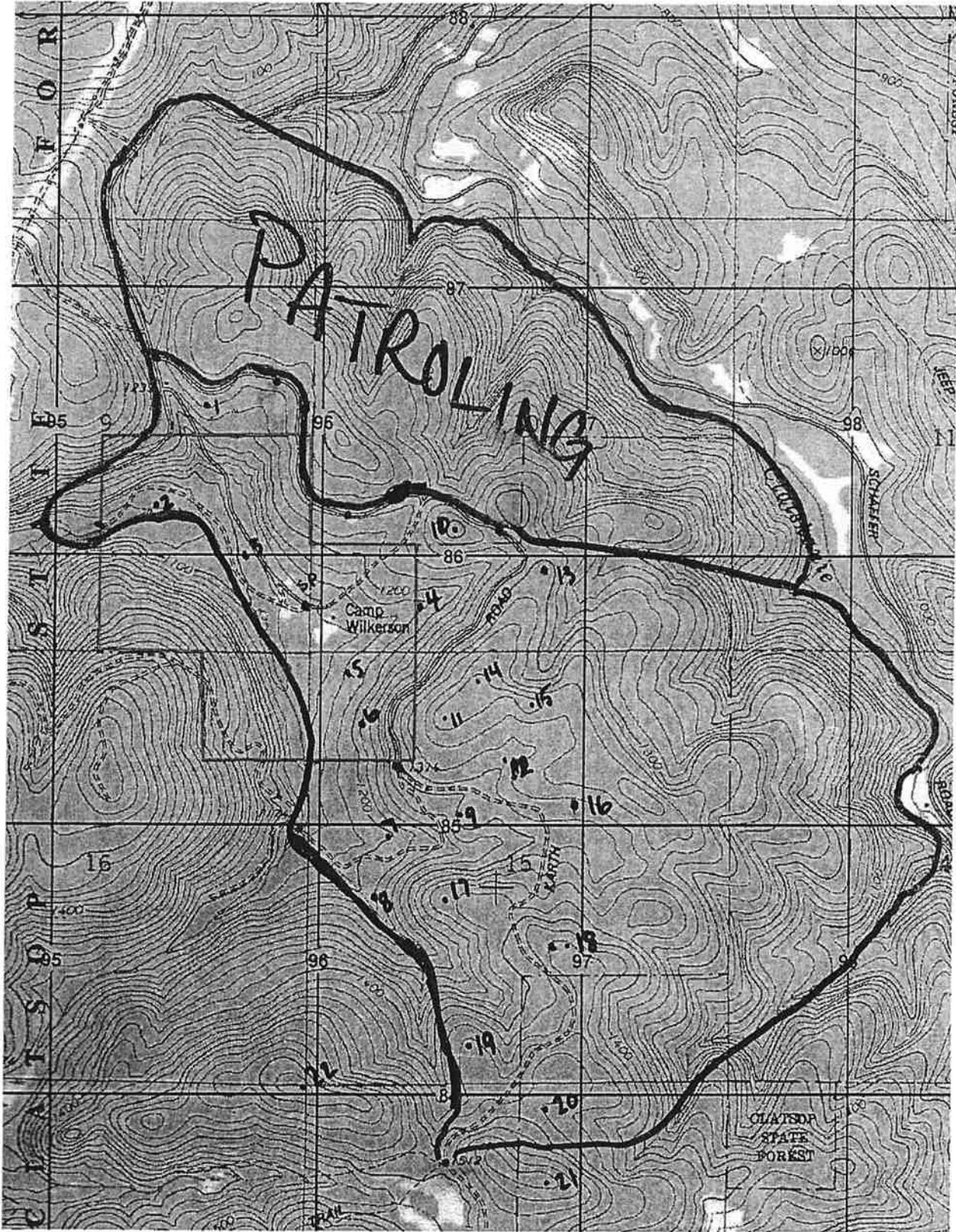



MEMORANDUM FOR Columbia County Parks, 1054 Oregon St., St. Helens, Or 97051

SUBJECT: Request for use of Camp Wilkerson for Army ROTC Field Training Exercise

1. Request that the University of Portland Army ROTC be allowed to conduct training on Camp Wilkerson from 18-20 FEB 2011. Training will be conducted using inert, rubberized, M16A2 rifles in accordance with pre commissioning requirements of CC REG 145-3.
2. The following training is to be conducted in the approximate timeline:
 - a. Night Land Navigation – 18 Feb 2100-0200
 - b. Field Bivouac – 19 Feb 0200-0600
 - c. Daytime Land Navigation – 19 Feb 0800-1200.
 - d. Situational Training Exercises (STX) – 19 Feb 1300-1800
 - e. Night Land Navigation and Night Patrolling 19 Feb 1900-0200.
 - f. Field Bivouac – 20 Feb 0200-0600
 - g. STX/Patrol Evaluations- 20 Feb 0700-1300
 - h. Site Clean-Up – 20 Feb 1300-1430
 - i. Site Departure – 20 Feb 1530
3. The attached map indicates the tentative locations for our STX lane training. There is also a tentative paintball lane planned. If permitted, any and all paintball use will be restricted to the small area outlined in red in the box marked as area 3. No paintball projectiles will be used on the camp itself, only in the surrounding forest to the direct north of the horse camp.
4. The attached topographical map is of the tentative location of our land navigation points and patrolling areas.

NOTE: LIAHONA TRAIL IS MARKED IN A COUNTER CLOCKWISE DIRECTION

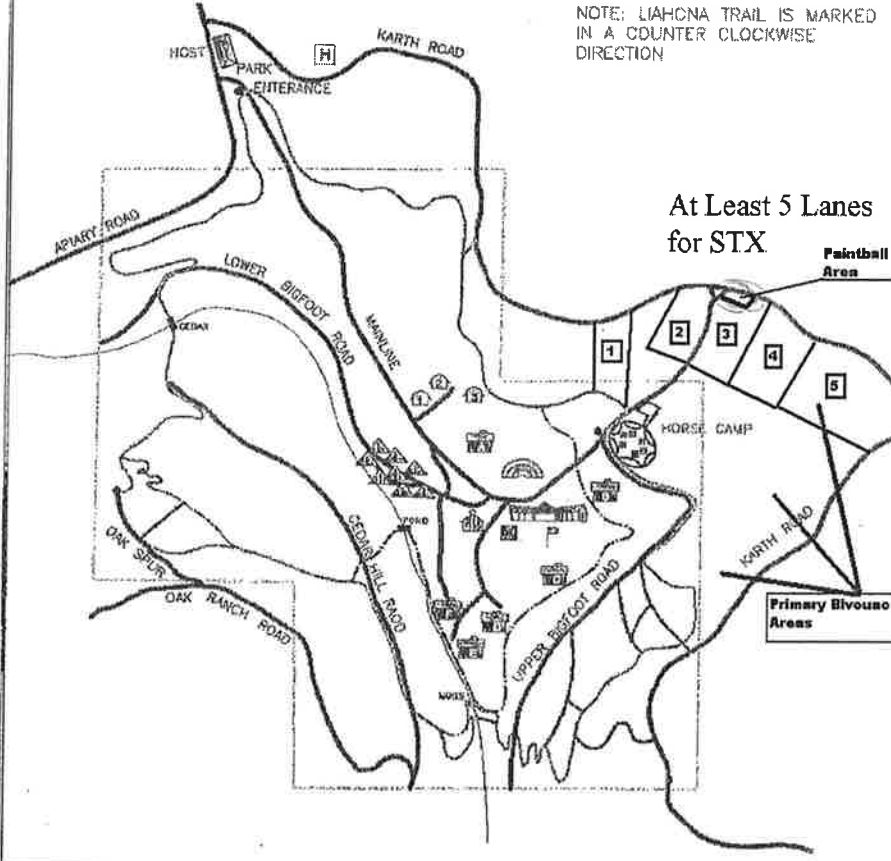

ORDER NO. 13-2011

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 3B of the Columbia County Building Code Ordinance, the Board may, by order or resolution, adopt subsequent editions of the State Building Code and related codes as necessary to stay current with state statutes and administrative rules or as otherwise may be in the best interest of the citizenry of Columbia County; and

WHEREAS, The Oregon State Specialty Codes no longer are required to be formally adopted by local government with the exception of certain Appendices which are not adopted by the State, but rather left to local governments to adopt; and


WHEREAS, the Board has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizenry to adopt certain appendices of the Oregon State Structural Specialty Code and the 1997 "Uniform Code for the Abatement of Dangerous Buildings".

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the following codes are hereby adopted and shall have the same force and effect as though their entire text were fully written or inserted herein:

1. Appendix G, Flood-resistant Construction, and Appendix J, Grading, of the 2010 Oregon State Structural Specialty Code are hereby adopted; and
2. The 1997 "Uniform Code for the Abatement of Dangerous Buildings" sponsored by the International Conference of Building Officials is hereby adopted.
