WHEREAS, on July 5, 2012, Animal Control Officer Roger Kadell arrived at 58395 Lindsay Lane, Warren, an unincorporated area of Columbia County, Oregon, in response to a call from resident Dean Crandall, who reported that his dog "Lucy," a female Dachshund, had been shot by a neighbor; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Crandall stated that he recently moved into the house on Lindsay Lane, and that on July 1, 2012, his neighbor, later identified as Elijah Olson, called complaining that Lucy was in the chicken area of the Olsons' yard and that two of the Olsons' chickens were missing; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Crandall further explained that July 3, 2012, Mr. Olson shot Lucy with a gun because, according to Mr. Olson, Lucy was attacking his chickens; and

WHEREAS, Officer Kadell examined Lucy and photographed her wounds. Mr. Crandall reported that Lucy had received veterinary care for her gun shot wound, and no surgery was necessary because the bullet had passed cleanly through her head; and

WHEREAS, Officer Kadell later met with Elijah Olson on July 5, 2012, at his residence at 58401 Lindsay Lane, Warren, Oregon; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Olson stated that he began to lose chickens when the Crandalls moved in about two weeks prior; and

WHEREAS, according to Mr. Olson, Lucy had been in his fenced yard chasing chickens on multiple occasions. He confirmed that Lucy was in his yard on July 1, 2012, and that Dean Crandall and his adult son removed Lucy from his property at his request. According to Mr. Olson, Mr. Crandall expressed disbelief that Lucy would hurt chickens; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Olson stated on July 3, 2012, Lucy had entered his yard and attacked chickens within his chicken coop, which is a secured enclosure within the fenced yard. Because Lucy did not leave in response to his shouts, he used his .38 caliber hand gun to fire a warning shot. Lucy continued to attack the chickens. He then fired a second shot, which he believed hit the dog. Lucy then ran off toward the Crandall residence; and

ORDER NO. 37-2012

WHEREAS, following the attack, Mr. Olson found six chickens inside the coop with bite marks and torn feathers; and

WHEREAS, Officer Kadell also interviewed Mae Johnson, a home-health nurse who is employed at the Olson residence and who witnessed the attack. Ms. Johnson reported that while she was working at the Olson residence on July 3, 2012, she saw Lucy attack the chickens in the chicken coop. She stated that she also saw Lucy on July 5th, the day of Officer Kadell's interview, inside the fenced chicken area; and

WHEREAS, based on the information obtained during his investigation, Officer Kadell determined that Lucy was subject to impoundment under ORS 609.155 for harming and chasing livestock; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Crandall surrendered Lucy for impoundment on July 10, 2012, and pursuant to ORS 609.156, Mr. Crandall was provided notice of the opportunity to request a hearing in a letter dated July 12, 2012; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Crandall has waived a hearing; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Crandall signed a Settlement Agreement admitting that Lucy chased and harmed livestock on July 3, 2012 and agreeing to certain conditions regarding the keeping of Lucy; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners considered the Animal Control Officer's report on this matter, along with the recommendation of the Animal Control Officer at its meeting on July 18, 2012.

NOW, THEREFORE, based on the report of the Animal Control Officer on this matter, attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by reference, and the above recitals, the Board of County Commissioners makes the following findings and conclusions:

- 1. Dean Crandall, who resides at 58395 Lindsay Lane, Warren, Oregon, is the registered owner of Lucy, a brown and black Dachshund.
- 2. On July 3, 2012, Lucy chased and attacked chickens within a fenced and secured enclosure on the Elijah Olson's property at 58401 Lindsay Lane, Warren, Oregon.
- 3. During the attack, Lucy bit the chickens and tore at their feathers.
- 4. Lucy, therefore chased and injured livestock in violation of ORS 609.155.
- 5. According to Columbia County Animal Control, Lucy has no prior record of killing, wounding, injuring or chasing livestock.

ORDER NO. 37-2012

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Columbia County Animal Control shall release Lucy to Dean Crandall, subject to the following conditions:

- 1. Dean Crandall shall take measures to prevent recurrence, including compliance with the conditions set forth in the Settlement Agreement, attached hereto as Exhibit "B."
- 2. Pursuant to ORS 609.162(1)(b), a civil penalty of \$250.00 is imposed on Dean Crandall for the livestock chase and injury carried out by his dog Lucy.
- 3. Pursuant to ORS 609.155(3)(a), in addition to the \$250.00 civil penalty imposed, above, Dean Crandall shall pay all costs and fees arising from the impoundment of the dog, as described in the Statement of Costs, attached hereto as Exhibit "C" and incorporated herein by this reference, and all boarding fees at a rate of \$15 per day for Lucy, accruing from July 10, 2012, to the date at which Mr. Crandall retrieves Lucy from Animal Control.
- 4. Any penalties or impoundment and boarding costs and fees imposed by this Order shall be paid prior to the release of Lucy, unless otherwise agreed to in writing by the County.

A complaint has been filed indicating that a dog owned by you has been involved in the harming or chasing of livestock in violation of ORS 609.155. ORS 609.155 provides that upon complaint of evidence of a dog harming or chasing livestock that the dog "shall be impounded" pending the a determination by the county if the dog harmed, or chase livestock.

You will receive notice of an opportunity to request a hearing under ORS 609.156 and information on the hearing process from the County Attorney. Pending the outcome of the hearing the dog at issue will remain in the custody and care of the Columbia County Animal Control.

The penalty and fees for actions of a dogs found to having harmed and chased livestock can be considerable. Serious consideration regarding the hearing process should be considered. Failure to request a hearing within the notification process will result in the finding that the owner is conclusively presumed to have admitted the matter alleged and the county may take action under ORS 609.162 and 609.163.

In this case you may have also been issued a citation for violation of ORS 609.095 dog as a public nuisance, ORS 609.100 unlicensed dog, and /or ORS 609.060 dog running at large. These violation will be separate issue directed to the Justice Court and independent of the harming or chasing livestock issues before the County Board of Commissioner.

Dog Lucy would need to be micro chipped by the county prior to release.
















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SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

This Settlement Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into by and between Columbia County, a political subdivision of the State of Oregon, and Dean Crandall.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Dean Crandall is the registered owner of the dog "Lucy", described as a brown and black Dachshund; and

WHEREAS, evidence shows that on July 3rd, 2012, Lucy chased, attacked and injured several chickens, belonging to Elijah Olson, within their fenced enclosure: and

WHEREAS, Lucy was impounded a the Columbia County Animal Shelter pursuant to ORS 609.155 for harming and chasing livestock; and

WHEREAS, Columbia County Animal Control initiated a proceeding before the Columbia County Board of Commissioners to determine whether Lucy's actions constitute a violation of ORS 609.155 and to determine costs and fees; and

WHEREAS, Dean Crandall has elected to waive her right to a hearing on the violation and enter into this Settlement Agreement with Columbia County for the release of Lucy and disposition of the violation.

AGREEMENT

In consideration of the mutual promises set forth below, the parties hereby agree as follows:

Dean Crandal hereby admits that his dog, Lucy, chased and harmed livestock, and agrees to the following:

- Lucy will be contained within the interior of the home, within a fenced area of at least 4 feet in height, or in an enclosed kennel when at the address of 58395 Lindsay Lane.
- 2. When Lucy is not contained within the home, fenced area or kennel and in an area where livestock animals are present, Lucy will be secured on a leash and under the direct handling of a person who is physically capable of maintaining control of Lucy.
- 3. Lucy will be micro chipped by Columbia County Animal Control and will be registered with the Department of Agriculture as required under ORS 609.168.
- 4. In the event Lucy escapes, Animal Control will be contacted immediately at non emergency dispatch number, (503) 397-3935.
- 5. The County will be immediately notified if Lucy is sold, transferred or rehomed.

- 6. Any acts of aggression by Lucy towards any person or livestock animal will be reported to Animal Control within 24 hours.
- 7. The Crandall's will pay the minimum civil fees of \$250 as required under ORS 609.162 (b) for a dog that has chased and harmed livestock.
- 8. The Crandall's will pay all impound, boarding, micro chip, civil penalties within 5 days of this order and/or prior to the release of the dog Lucy.
- 9. Failure to comply with any of the above terms will constitute a violation of ORS 609.095 (maintaining a dog as a public nuisance) and will subject Lucy to impoundment.

Dean Crandall further agrees to release and hold harmless Columbia County, its officers, agents and employees for any and all claims, suits or actions of any nature, including claims of injury to any person or persons or of damage to property arising out of the County's impoundment of the dog Lucy and enforcement of OTS 609.155.

Columbia County hereby agrees to release Lucy to Dean Crandall upon payment of all penalties, fees and costs as determined by Columbia Columbia County Board Order No. 37-2012 which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.
