WHEREAS, Columbia County Information Technology ("IT") staff have determined that the items of computer-related and other personal property listed below are no longer needed for use by Columbia County:

WHEREAS, IT staff have determined that the computer-related personal property listed above has absolutely no value and should be disposed of in a responsible manner through the County's E-waste program or otherwise; and

WHEREAS, IT staff have determined that the vintage safe should be donated to the Columbia County Museum Association; and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that the two FEMA trailers described below and currently located at 850 Maple Street, Vernonia, OR, are no longer needed for use by Columbia County and that said trailers should be sold at auction, donated or otherwise disposed of:

2005 Cavalier, Model No. 07E1009ADA
Manufacturer ID No. ACBC06AL0137147, HUD No. NTA 1383920

2006 Dutch, Model No. RG145401
Manufacturer ID No. 210E400812A-00-H-D, HUD No. N/A

and

WHEREAS, the FEMA trailers are not to be sold for residential purposes, and any sale documents must clearly state that they may not be used for residential purposes;


NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED as follows:

- 1) The items of computer-related personal property, the vintage safe and the two FEMA trailers listed above are not needed for public purposes and are therefore declared surplus to the County's needs.
- 2) The IT staff are authorized to dispose of the computer-related property through the E-waste program or in any other appropriate, responsible manner.
- 3) The IT staff are authorized to donate the vintage safe to the Columbia County Museum Association.
- 4) The FEMA trailers shall be sold at auction with the sale documents clearly stating that they may not be used for residential purposes, and, if not sold, shall be donated for use as office or storage space, or disposed of in any other appropriate, responsible manner.


