WHEREAS pursuant to Section 6 of Ordin	ance No	90 - 23 Colu	mhia County A	mhul

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 6 of Ordinance No. 90-23, Columbia County Ambulance Service Ordinance, the Board of County Commissioners for Columbia County, Oregon, adopted Ambulance Service Areas and, pursuant to Section 8 of that Ordinance, the Board mandated that no person may provide ambulance service in Columbia County without being fully franchised in accordance with the applicable provisions; and

WHEREAS, current franchises are due to expire on December 31, 2015; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 9 of the Ordinance and Order No. 169-5, the Ambulance Service Administrator (the "Administrator") requested franchise renewal applications on July 9, 2015; and

WHEREAS, also pursuant to Section 9 of the Ordinance, the Administrator received a renewal application from the Clatskanie Rural Fire Protection District dated August 31, 2015, for Ambulance Service Area 5 (ASA-5), which is generally in the Clatskanie area; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 11 of the Ordinance, the Administrator reviewed the renewal application and recommended renewal of the ambulance service franchise for ASA-5 to the Clatskanie Rural Fire Protection District; and

WHEREAS, a copy of the Administrator's recommendation is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and is incorporated herein by this reference; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 12 of the Ordinance, the Board of County Commissioners held a public hearing on December 16, 2015, to consider the application;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the ambulance service franchise for Service Area 5 is hereby granted to the Clatskanie Rural Fire Protection District for the period beginning January 1, 2016, and ending December 31, 2020, subject to the terms and conditions of the Ordinance No. 90-23, and the Ambulance Service Plan.

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ORDER NO. 60 -2015

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that Franchisee will be subject to any and all changes to the Ambulance Services Area Plan and the Ambulance Service Ordinance made during this franchise term.

ASA Franchise Renewal Recommendations

I have received and reviewed all of the required applications for Ambulance Service Area Franchises from four of the Fire Districts in Columbia County. I also received an application from Metro West Ambulance who serves the Vernonia Fire District by contract.

I have reviewed each franchisee's renewal application and found them to be sufficient. Each applicant has provided ambulance service for the past five years, which has met or exceeded the requirements set forth in Ordinance #90-23, and the County Ambulance Service Plan. Based on this precedent and the information contained in the renewal applications, I feel that they will provide adequate ambulance service for their prospective Ambulance Service Areas within Columbia County.

I recommend that a franchise to provide ambulance service within each of the Ambulance Service Areas, under the terms, conditions and duties as listed in Columbia County Ambulance Service Ordinance, Number 90-23, be granted to the following applicants beginning January 1, 2016, and ending on December 31, 2020:

Scappoose Rural Fire District

ASA 2

Vernonia Rural Fire District/Metro West Ambulance

ASA 7

Mist-Birkenfeld Rural Fire District

ASA 6

Clatskanie Rural Fire District

ASA 5

Columbia River Fire and Rescue District

ASA 3, ASA 4

(Per ordinance 90-23, ASA 1, located on the northern tip of Sauvie Island, is included in the Multnomah County ASA plan and is not included in this process.)
