In the Matter of a Livestock Attack by Dog)
Owned by Stacy Evans and Brenna Craft) ORDER NO. 83-2020

WHEREAS, Officer Roger Kadell's investigation report, attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by this reference, provides relevant facts in this matter; and

WHEREAS, on August 28, 2020, Allison Charnbonneau called the County to report that a pit bull dog was on her property, located at 58833 Ward Drive, St. Helens, OR 97051, the dog was attacking and trying to kill her alpaca, and that the alpaca's leg was torn up and that the dog was still loose in the pasture attacking animals; and

WHEREAS, on August 28, 2020, Animal Control Officer Roger Kadell arrived at Ms. Charnbonneau's property in response to the call and found that Ms. Charnbonneau had the dog secured in her front yard; and

WHEREAS, Officer Kadell observed that the dog was a pit bull and had blood on its back, paws and mouth; and

WHEREAS, Officer Kadell initially believed the dog was black and white when the dog was wet with blood, but later discovered that the dog was brown and white; and

WHEREAS, Officer Kadell observed that Ms. Charnbonneau had two injured alpacas and noted that one of the alpacas was "torn around the underside by the back legs and again under the neck area under the area near the front legs" and "several areas were actively bleeding and torn skin could be seen"; and

WHEREAS, Officer Kadell photographed the alpacas injuries. Copies of these photographs are included in Officer Kadell's investigation report on this matter, attached hereto as Exhibit "A"; and

WHEREAS, Officer Kadell observed that the Charnbonneau family made efforts to stop the alpacas from bleeding; and

WHEREAS, during the investigation, the Charnbonneau family informed Officer Kadell that the alpaca with the more severe injuries was taken to local veterinary clinic, surgery was performed on the alpaca to remove its scrotum due to it being mostly torn off, and follow up veterinary visits are expected; and

WHEREAS, based on the information obtained during the investigation, Officer Kadell impounded the dog under ORS 609.155 for chasing and injuring livestock; and

WHEREAS, Officer Kadell initially identified the dog owner as Brenna Craft based on the County dog license registry and Columbia Humane Society records. Records show that the dog's name is "Moose"; and

WHEREAS, on August 28, 2020, Stacy Evans contacted Officer Kadell to discuss the incident. She informed Officer Kadell that she is the current owner of Moose and that she obtained ownership two months ago from her niece Brenna Craft. Ms. Evans reported that on the day of the subject incident her son took Moose to his grandparents' house, located at 58841 Ward Drive, St. Helens, OR 97051, where Moose escaped; and

WHEREAS, Officer Kadell discovered that Moose's dog license tag was expired on August 31, 2018; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to ORS 609.156, on September 8, 2020, County mailed Stacy Evans and Brenna Craft notice of the opportunity to request a hearing on this matter; and

WHEREAS, on October 2, 2020, the Board of County Commissioners held a hearing on this matter. During the hearing, Officer Kadell, Stacy Evans and Alison Charbonneau testified; and

WHEREAS, Officer Kadell recommended that the Board of County Commissioners impose a fine in the amount of \$500.00 and require payment of impoundment and boarding fees from August 28 to September 28; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners considered Officer Roger Kadell's investigation report on this matter, along with his recommendation;

NOW, THEREFORE, based on the evidence presented, including the Animal Control Officer Roger Kadell's report on this matter, attached hereto as Exhibit "A", and the above recitals, the Board of County Commissioners makes the following findings and conclusions:

1. Stacy Evans is the owner of the dog named Moose, a pit bull terrier.
2. On August 28, 2020, Moose chased and injured two Alpacas, belonging to Allison Charbonneau, at 58833 Ward Drive, St. Helens, OR 97051.
3. According to Officer Kadell, Moose has no prior record of killing, wounding, injuring or chasing livestock under ORS 609.162(2). There is no evidence in the record for this matter to find that Moose previously killed, wounded, injured or chased livestock. Therefore, the Board of County Commissioners finds that Moose has not previously killed, wounded, injured or chased livestock;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Columbia County Animal Control Officer shall release Moose to Stacy Evans, subject to the following conditions:

1. Moose shall not return to the property located at 58841 Ward Drive, St. Helens, OR 97051.

2. Moose shall not be located anywhere in the Columbia County where the dog may present a threat to livestock.
3. Stacy Evans shall obtain a dog license for Moose.
4. Stacy Evans shall contact the microchip company that maintains the database with Moose's ownership information and register as Moose's current owner, and provide a copy of the microchip registration showing her as the registered owner to the County Animal Control Officer, who will register the chip with the Department of Agriculture as required under ORS 609.168.
5. Pursuant to ORS 609.162(1)(b), Stacy Evans shall pay a civil penalty of \$500.00 for the incident involving Moose chasing and injuring livestock owned by Ms. Charnbonneau, on August 28, 2020.
6. Pursuant to ORS 609.155(3)(a), in addition to the civil penalty imposed, above, Stacy Evans shall pay all costs and fees arising from the impoundment of Moose, as described in the Statement of Costs, attached hereto as Exhibit "B" and incorporated herein by this reference, and all boarding fees at a rate of \$15.00 per day for Moose for the period of August 28, 2020 to September 28, 2020.
7. Stacy Evans shall pay any penalties, impoundment, boarding costs and fees imposed by this Order, provide a copy of a current dog license for Moose, provide proof that ownership of Moose was transferred from Brenna Craft to her, and provide a copy of the microchip registration showing her as the registered owner, prior to the release of the dog, unless otherwise agreed to in writing by the County.
8. Moose shall be deemed surrendered to the County if Stacy Evans does not retrieve Moose within 14 days of the date of this Order.

NARRATIVE

Summary:

On 08/28/2020 at 2:40 pm, The dog Moose was apprehended after being observed attacking and causing injuries to an Alpaca owned by Allison Charbonneau. Moose was removed from the location and impounded at the Columbia County Animal Control Shelter. The current owner of Moose was identified as Stacy Evans. Ms. Evans was advised of Moose's impoundment. Follow up later found that a second Alpaca at the location was also injured.

Narrative:

On 08/28/2020 at 13:40 hours, I responded to the address of 58833 Ward Drive, Saint Helens Oregon on a report of a Pit bull dog attacking and trying to kill the callers Alpaca. The caller, Allison Charbonneau reported that the alpaca's leg was torn up and that the offending dog was still loose in the pasture attacking the animals.

When I arrived, I found that the Charbonneau family had caught the dog that was attacking their Alpaca's and that they had the dog secured in their front yard. The dog was found to be a brown and white pit bull that when wet with the blood looked black and white. The offending dog was found to have a Columbia Humane Society tag # 009227 on a collar on its neck. I noted that there was blood on the back of the dog, on his paws and around his mouth.

Ms. Charbonneau took me to the fenced pasture area where the Alpaca's were inside a lean too shed. I noted that the animal had been torn around the underside by the back legs and again under the neck area near the front legs. Several areas were actively bleeding and torn skin could be seen. I took photos of the injuries and the family began working to stop the flow of blood. The Charbonneau advised that they had already been calling vets to see who could come to check on the animal.

I was later advised that they took the more seriously injured Alpaca to Valley Vet where surgery was preformed which included the removal of the scrotum due to it being mostly torn off. Follow up vet visits are expected.

I noted that the property is semi rural but near the city limits of Saint Helens. The property had portions of the front area fenced into two separate pasture areas with hog fencing boarding the area. The Rp and I both noted that the dog could enter the area by pushing up and under the fencing.

I took possession of the offending dog and removed the collar and tag for identification. I noted that the collar contained a Columbia Humane Society tag # 009227. The dog was placed in my truck and transported to the Shelter in Saint Helens. At the Shelter, I contacted Sally Rogers with the Columbia Humane Society. She checked the shelter records and identified the dog as Moose, that was adopted by Brenna Craft, 34474 Bachelor Flat Road, Saint Helens. Near the location of the incident.

A check of county records, found that a Breenna Craft with a home address listed as 34474 Bachelor Flat road, had registered a dog named Moose in 2017, but that the license tags for the dog had expired on

8/31/2018. The file also listed a mailing address of 107 West E Street Rainier Oregon.

While completing the intake paperwork, I received a call from a Stacy Evans. Ms. Evans told me that she had become the owner of the dog Moose 2 months ago and that she resided in Saint Helens at 98 Shore Drive #13. She told me that Brenna Evans was her niece. That her son took the dog to the grand parents home on Bachelor Flat Road as they were dog sitting the grandparents other dogs. That Moose escaped while at the location.

Ms. Evans told me that with everything going on, they had not done any paper work on ownership transfer and that she had not licensed the dog in her name yet. We discussed the issues with Livestock attacks and I agreed to call her back on Tuesday September 1st to review the options. She was advised that the dog was being placed on a livestock hold.

After speaking with Ms. Evans, Sally with the Columbia Humane Society came and advised me that the adoption contract that Ms. Craft signed requires that they be part of and approve any transfer of ownership of the dog. She also advised that the dog would need a covered kennel as he was a fence climber when at the shelter in the past. The Columbia Humane Agreed to care for the dog in their shelter area while the livestock process was carried out.

As follow up, I proceeded to Stacy Evans address of 98 Shore Drive #13. I did not find her home but left a copy of the intake form that contains livestock attack impound information. Ms. Evans called and said she received the posting. On 08/29/2020, I proceeded to the address of 107 West E street in Rainier the reported address for Breanna Craft. Finding no one home I posted a copy of the impound notice as well.

On 09/01/2020, as agreed, I recontacted Ms. Evans. I discussed with her the issue of ownership and the issues presented by the Columbia Humane. Ms. Evans indicated that she did wish to proceed with a hearing and for a determination to be made if the dog could be returned to her as she resided within the city and not in a livestock area.

Ms. Evans was advised that a packet would be sent to her and that a second packet of the same information may also be sent to her niece Breanna Craft as both had potential ownership interest in this animal. I advised her that the Columbia Humane had indicated they would also send a representative to the hearing to voice their concerns over the dogs return or placement with Ms. Evans.

All dogs impounded are held at the Animal shelter located at 2084 Oregon, St. Helens. Call the Sheriff Office records at: 503-366-4611 to make arrangements to redeem your dog.

STRAY / NUISANCE / RABIES: Any dog impounded as a Stray/Nuisance/or for lacking rabies

Vaccination's may be held for 5 days. Upon completion of the 5 day hold period, the ownership of the animal may be transferred and/or the animal may be euthanized.

QUARANTINE: VISITATION OF THE ANIMAL WILL NOT BE PERMITTED

Animals impounded for quarantine (bite) will be held for the ten days. The owner of the dog is

required to make arrangements for the dog before the end of the ten day hold period. Dogs not

redeemed at the end of the ten days may be euthanized without additional notice if unclaimed by

the owners. Quarantine fee is \$180, plus license fees and any other medical care fees.

ABUSE/NEGLECT/ POLICE HOLDS: Animals on a police hold for animal abuse, neglect or other charges will need a release from the investigating officer or the courts prior to release.

OWNER REG: Animals surrendered by the owner may be subject to billing for the fees due and the animal may be euthanized without additional notification.

D/O IN CUSTODY: Dogs held for person who were arrested are held for five days unless arrangements have been made with the county. Dogs at the end of five days will be considered

abandoned by their owners and subject to transfer/adoption and or euthanasia.

LIVESTOCK SEIZURES: A complaint has been filed that a dog owned by you or under your control has been involved in the harming or chasing of livestock in violation of ORS 609.155. ORS 609.155 requires that the dog be impounded and held pending a determination by the County.

You will receive notice and information of an opportunity to request a hearing under ORS 609.156 from the County Attorney. Failure to request a hearing will result in a finding that the owner is conclusively presumed to having admitted to the matters at hand. The County may take action at that time under the statues which may include ordering the dog to be euthanized.

The penalties for dogs harming or chasing livestock are considerable and serious consideration should be taken. Impound fees, boarding fees along with fines and other fees may be accessed by the County.

INFORMATION: Time is always an issue when animals are held at the shelter. Owner and/or keeper's who fail to contact the shelter or to make arrangements for their animals, run the risk of the animal being transferred or euthanized without additional notification.
