An Ordinance Defining Kennel	
and Prescribing Fees for	
Dogs Kept in Kennels	

## ORDINANCE NO. 201

WHEREAS, ORS 609.100 provides that counties may establish special license fees for dogs kept in kennels; and

WHEREAS, a special license must be established before you so March 1, 1978, in order to be effective for 1978;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE POLK COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

## Section 1. A Kennel is a facility which:

- (a) houses five or more adult dogs;
- (b) kept for the exclusive purpose of sale, lease, breeding, boarding, show, hunting, racing or herding and not as pets; and
- (c) confined at all times so as to be unable to run free except when actually in use for the purpose they are kept.

Section 2. Dogs kept in kennels shall be licensed individually by the owner of the dogs. Fees for licenses for dogs kept in kennels are as follows:

- (a) first 5 to 10 dogs ......\$5 per dog
- (b) eleventh to twentieth dogs.....\$2.50 per dog

Section 3. This ordinance does not apply to dogs which

are taxed as inventory under ORS 310.608.

Section 4. This ordinance being necessary for the immediate protection of the public health, safety and welfare, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance takes effect upon passage.
