FOR COLUMBIA COUNTY, OREGON
In the Matter of an Ordinance
Closing Dibblee Beach to
Overnight Use $\quad$, ORDINANCE NO. $88-12$

The Board of County Commissioners for Columbia County, Oregon ordains as follows:

SECTION 1. AUTHORITY.
This ordinance is adopted pursuant to ORS 203.035.
SECTION 2. TITLE.
This ordinance shall be known as Ordinance No. 88-12.
SECTION 3. PURPOSE.
The purpose of this ordinance is to close the area known as Dibblee Beach to overnight use.

SECTION 4. DEFINITION.
For the purposes of this ordinance, Dibblee Beach means those county-owned lands described in Exhibit "A", which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference, and as shown by Exhibit " B ", which is also attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.

SECTION 5. PROHIBITED USE OF DIBBLEE BEACH.
Except as specifically permitted by a "person in charge" as defined below, no person shall enter or remain, or allow their property or property under their control to enter or remain, on Dibblee Beach between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m. each day.

## SECTION 6. ENFORCEMENT.

Any on-duty Oregon State Police Officer, the Columbia County Sheriff, any of his deputies, and any Columbia County Commissioner are designated as "persons in charge" within the meaning of ORS 164.205(5) (1987 Replacement Part) for the purpose of supervising county-owned lands at Dibblee Beach.

SECTION 7. PENALTIES.
A person shall be considered a trespasser: 1) who enters or remains on Dibblee Beach during the hours such lands are closed under the terms of this ordinance; or 2) who fails to leave Dibblee Beach when so requested by a "person in charge".

Trespassers are subject to the provisions of ORS 164.245, Criminal Trespass in the Second Degree.

SECTION 8. POSTING OF NOTICES.
By January 1, 1989, the County Roadmaster/Public Works Director shall post signs in conspicuous places on the county's property limits at Dibblee Beach. Such signs shall declare that Dibblee Beach is closed for use between the hours of 10:00 pom. and 5:00 a.m., and that trespassers shall be prosecuted.

SECTION 9. SEVERABILITY.
If any provision of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision and such holdings shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.

SECTION 10. EMERGENCY.
This ordinance being immediately necessary to maintain the public health, safety and welfare, an emergency is declared to exist and this ordinance takes effect on January 1, 1989.
